I write in connection with your request for information received by both Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies on the 4th January 2017. This response is being provided on behalf of Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies as a result of ongoing collaboration. In your requests you sought access to the following information:

Does Norfolk/Suffolk police force have lots of small custody units or a few large custody centres. If the answer is a lot of small units are there any plans to amalgamate these into a few large custody centres?

Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies holds information relevant to your request.

Response to your request

The following information has been located as relevant to your request.

Norfolk and Suffolk Constabulary have 6 Police Investigation Centres where all arrested persons are processed.

These Police Investigation Centres (PICs) replaced the previous Norfolk and Suffolk Constabulary custody suites which were in use up until 2010/11.

Wymondham	Norfolk	30 cells
