

**Freedom of Information Request Reference N<sup>o</sup>: FOI 001012-18**

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 16/03/2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“Over the last five calendar years please can you tell me how many incidents of hate speech have been reported to the police force, what category of hate speech each has come under e.g. racism, antisemitism, and how many reports have led to an arrest or caution of if no action was taken after investigating.”*

**Response to your Request**

The response provided below is correct as of 23.03.2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

Suffolk Constabulary does not record incidents with specific reference to ‘hate speech’, however there are offences relating to ‘Acts intended to stir up racial or religious hatred’. A search has therefore been conducted utilising the most relevant Home Office classifications, those being; 066/23, 066/25, 066/26, 066/45, 066/48 and 066/51.

The information in the below table was retrieved from the Constabulary’s crime systems and broken down by year, type of hate and outcome.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
