



## Freedom of Information Request Reference N<sup>o</sup>: FOI 004892-17

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 11 May 2017 in which you sought access to the following information:

*"I understand the limitations behind Section 12, therefore I am prepared to narrow the original scope of my request. So can I please now request information on the number of incidents police in your force area were called to where the drug 'Spice' was mentioned as a contributory factor for the period **March 2016 to March 2017**."*

*I am also happy for you to use the search terms 'smoking spice' or 'smoked spice', which would eliminate the possibility of erroneous results simply containing the word 'spice' from showing up."*

### Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 11 May 2017

Suffolk Constabulary has located the following information as relevant to your request.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary's call system, STORM, for all incidents recorded that contain the word 'Spice', from 2015 to the date of the request.

Each incident log was then individually reviewed to remove those where the reference to Spice was not in relation to the synthetic cannabinoid i.e. names of people, roads etc.

The information provided on the attached spreadsheet confirms the date of the call, whether a subsequent crime was recorded, the outcome and a brief summary extracted from the freetext.

***Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.***

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
