I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 7 January 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

“ Please disclose the number of crimes reported at "nurseries", "nursery schools" and "pre-schools" in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 (calendar years);*

** Please provide a breakdown showing the type of crime reported;*

** Please also disclose, where known and if within the cost limit, the outcome of the report - for example individual charged with XX. If an individual was charged please disclose whether they were an "employee" or "other".”*

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 15 January 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary’s crime system for all offences recorded that contain ‘Nursery’, ‘Nurseries’ or ‘pre-school’ within the location of the offence. These were then manually reviewed to remove those that did not relate to the location of a nursery, for example a garden nursery etc.

The attached spreadsheet confirms the total number of offences recorded, including the offence type, outcome and year.

For those offences where a charge was made, the suspect detail is recorded as ‘Other’ in all cases.

Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
