I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 27th January, 2020 in which you sought access to the following information:

“The number of road traffic accidents and incidents that have occurred in and around Redlingfield in 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and (thus far) in 2020.

The specific Roads we are interested in are in the attached picture and listed below:-

- *Cranley Green Road*
- *Occold road*
- *Mill Road*
- *Church Road*
- *Green Lane/Redlingfield Road/Horham Road*
- *Low Road (and that section B1117)*
- *Woodlane Road*
- *Park Road*

We do not require any information relating to the identities of any persons involved - simply what and when and where eg:-

- *single car crash , on date (or just month/year) on Occold Road.*
- *or exceeding speed limit, on date (or just month/year), Cranley Green Road.”*

The response provided below is correct as of 4 February 2020

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary's accident records for all road traffic collisions that have been reported to the Constabulary at the locations stated above.

The information provided below includes the date, location and details of the collision.

14/05/2015 - Occold Road, single vehicle collision, no injuries
27/08/2016 - B1117, two vehicle collision, minor injuries
24/09/2017 - Low Road, single vehicle collision, minor injuries
02/04/2018 - Cranley Green Road, two vehicle collision, minor injuries
22/01/2019 - Southolt Road, two vehicle collision, no injuries
06/02/2019 - B1117, two vehicle collision, no injuries

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the
Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
