I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk and Norfolk Constabularies on 13th February, 2019 which you sought access to the following information:

“Q1. How many cases of pram / buggy theft were reported in the last 12 months, or last calendar year (2018)?

Q2. How many cases of pram / buggy theft were reported in the 12 months prior to the period reported in question 1, or the previous calendar year (2017)?

Q3. In the period outlined in question 1, what area (suburb, street) had the highest number of recorded pram thefts, and how many were recorded?

Q4. How many cases of pram / buggy theft were reported in the 12 months prior to the period reported in question 2, or the previous calendar year (2016)?

Q5. How many cases of pram / buggy theft were reported in the 12 months prior to the period reported in question 3, or the previous calendar year (2015)?”

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 19th February, 2019.

Suffolk and Norfolk Constabularies have considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabularies crime system for all Theft offences recorded during the 2015 – 2018 calendar years, where the crime summary includes the words Buggy, Pram, Pushchair, Stroller.

Please note that freetext searches are by their very nature unreliable and consequently there may be additional relevant offences that have not been captured in this response. It should also be noted that both Constabularies will record information in slightly different ways and therefore, the data cannot be used for comparative purposes.

The information provided in the table below confirms all theft offences containing the keywords searched for during the years requested, by Constabulary.

In relation to question 3 Great Yarmouth had the most Pram thefts recorded during 2018 in Norfolk and Ipswich had the most Pram thefts in Suffolk.

Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.
