I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 03rd April, 2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

“1) How many Vauxhall Corsa’s have been targeted by so-called Corsa Cannibals and been stripped of major bodywork parts, such as the bonnet or boot in your area this year?

How does this compare with the figures for the whole of 2017?

2) How does this compare with other similar sized vehicles such as Ford Fiestas, Renault Clios or VW Polos?

3) Do your crime analysts recognise Corsa Cannibals as a trend, and if so, why is it happening?”

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 09th, April 2018.

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

In response to questions 1 and 2 of your request a search has been carried out on our crime information system Athena under theft from vehicle where the stolen property was listed as Conveyance Bodywork - with vehicle models of Corsa, Fiesta, Clio and Polo.

From 01/01/2018 – 09/04/2018 there is a nil return. There is also a nil return specifically for Corsa’s in 2017. The table below shows the relevant information in relation to the other models specified in your request.

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the
Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
