I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 21 June 2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

“The number of hate crimes recorded by your force, by local authority, district or community safety partnership, during the following financial years:

- a) 2014/15
- b) 2015/16
- c) 2016/17
- d) 2017/18

Please break this data down by strand (e.g. race, sexual orientation) as well, so it is possible to see hate crimes by different strands by district during the above years.”

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 28 June 2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary's crime system for all Hate crime recorded for the 2014/15 – 2017/18 financial years.

The table provided below confirms the total number of offences recorded by Hate strand and Strategic Policing Command (SPC).

Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the Freedom of Information Act (2000).
