## **Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 002464-19**

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 5 July 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“To know if there is a fixed speed camera operating at the level of Brome in the A140 and if so, what is the speed limit of that camera.*

*I have checked and it seems that it is inactive since 2011 - 2012 and that the speed limit was reduced to 30mph in that area.*

*There seems to be a mobile camera that operates there every now and then.”*

## **Response to your Request**

The response provided below is correct as of 16 July 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

There used to be a Fixed Camera on the A140 Brome, Suffolk but this has not been active since March 2011.

Suffolk Constabulary began operating from a mobile van in this area in February 2012 and the van operates in a 40mph limit.

Norfolk and Suffolk's Central Ticket Offices merged in 2015 and there is no record confirming from which date the road at which the camera operates, became a 40mph limit.
