



## Freedom of Information Request Reference N<sup>o</sup>: FOI 002832-18

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 2 August 2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

“Please provide, from the whole force area, figures and details for the number of offences of animal cruelty - i.e. animals being abused or killed - with a break-down of each year, month and where.

Please provide for each offence:

- Details of the type of animal involved
- Summary of the MO test
- Location
- The number of arrests
- Police outcomes

In the first instance I would like the data from the 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2008 – 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018  
But if 10 years is not possible in the time frame, please may I have the past 5 years – so 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2013 – 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018.”

## Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 24 August 2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary’s crime system for all offences recorded that relate to animal cruelty as specified in the request above.

The attached spreadsheet provides all relevant offences, including the animal involved, summary of the MO, location (town), number of arrests and the recorded outcome.

Please be aware that arrest data is only available from 19 October 2015 onwards as a result in a change in custody recording system, with legacy data no longer being available for bulk data extraction. In addition, outcome data prior to this data is only recorded as detected or undetected.

***Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.***

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
