I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 7 August 2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“Please tell me from July 2012 to July 2018 how many times your Police Force Area recorded the following crimes:*

*61/24 - Making a counterfeit coin or note;*

*61/25 - Pass etc. counterfeit coin or note as genuine;*

*61/26 - Possess counterfeit coin or note;*

*61/27 - possess materials or dies to make counterfeit coin or note;*

*61/28 - Reproduce British currency note or make imitation coins*

*Please give me the number bi-annually, and broken down by the Home Office crime codes listed above”*

**Response to your Request**

The response provided below is correct as of 9 August 2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary’s crime system for all offences recorded under Home Office codes 61/24 – 61/28, for the respective years requested.

The information provided in the table below confirms the Constabulary only located offences under 61/25 and 61/25. Some of the time frames are not included owing to there being no offences recorded during this time frame.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
