Freedom of Information Request Reference N^o: FOI 002866/19

I write in connection with your request for information received by the Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies on the 8th August 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

Which three fixed position speed cameras in your area were responsible for (i) the issuing of the most fixed penalty notices to suspected speeders and (ii) were activated the most time by speeding vehicles in the combined three year period of 2016, 2017 and 2018?

Please provide me with the position of each of the three cameras and the number of FPNs issued as a result of it "catching" suspected speeders in that three-year period as well as the number of activations logged at that site.

NOTE: Please include average speed cameras for this analysis where the cameras have remained in the same position.

Please note that not all persons caught speeding will be issued with a FPN, individuals can also be summonsed to court. The number of FPNs issued does not represent the number subsequently paid, as a large number of individuals will opt to attend a speed awareness course, where this has been offered.

The main reasons for not processing activations are as follows:

- Excess glare.
- Foreign Vehicle,
- Image too dark,
- No Number Plate,
- No Trace PNC,
- Number Plate Unreadable,
- Obstruction to Number Plate,
- Plate Outside Image,
- Too far away
