



## Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 003385-19

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 20 September 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“A list of public locations in Suffolk (with an address) where police have found couples involved in ‘indecent acts’, including the number of times police have been called there, and when. Please provide the information for the last three years - 2017, 2018 and 2019 so far, and please also specify whether any arrests were made.”*

### Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 27 September 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary’s call system for all incidents recorded relating to sexual offences. The data was then filtered to exclude the event type ‘Crime-Sexual’ and the remainder were manually reviewed to ensure they related to indecent acts involving couples that were attended by the police.

The Constabulary located two incidents in total, both in 2017 at the following locations:

- A14 Newmarket
- Park, Langer Road, Felixstowe

There were no further calls identified from the search in relation to these locations and no arrests were made.
