

## Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 003432-19

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 24 September 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“The number of victims reporting incidents of homophobic or trans hate crime to your police force – each year from 2008/2009 through to 2018/19*

*The number of cases that resulted in a charges or summons being issued within this time frame.”*

### Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 8 October 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary’s crime system for all hate crime recorded that has a transgender or homophobic marker.

The data provided below confirms the total number of transgender or homophobic hate crimes recorded by year and number of offences that subsequently resulted in a charge.
