Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 27 September 2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary's crime system for all offences recorded at the location of Edgar Sewter Primary School and Wenhaston Primary School, during the years 2010 to the date of the request.

The information provided below confirms all crimes recorded for the aforementioned time frame.
