I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 30th September, 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

"I am trying to design a product that deals with the problem of powerboat and RIB security, particularly outboard engine thefts. In order to do this I require potential stakeholder's one of which, would be the police. During my research it would be helpful to find statistics of the crime rate regarding these matter, and so I was wondering if there was a chance you could send me some data as I cannot obtain this information online.

*Please may you conduct the data collection from the last 5 years
I would like you to conduct a search for crimes of 'outboard engine theft, within England and wales. However, I do not wish to know the outcomes of these crimes, just the volume of the crimes themselves"*

The response provided below is correct as of 10th October, 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

The below table relates to the number of outboard engine thefts that have taken place in Suffolk for the last 5 years broken down by crime classification.

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Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the
Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
