



## Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 003555-19

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk and Norfolk Constabularies on 2 October 2019 which you sought access to the following information:

1. *“For the years (i) 2017/18 and (ii) 2018/19 what is the fastest speed you have recorded a vehicle to have travelled on a road monitored by a speed camera? By “speed camera” I mean a fixed or temporary speed camera as well as portable speed cameras operated by officers and in-car cameras that can record the speed of other motorists.*
2. *What was the make and model of the vehicle and was it a police or civilian vehicle?*
3. *Where did the incident take place and what was the speed recorded?*
4. *Was the driver prosecuted? If so what was the penalty imposed? If not please provide a brief summary of the circumstances surrounding the incident.*

## Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 31 October 2019

Suffolk and Norfolk Constabularies have considered your request for information and the response is below.

The fastest speed travelled during the 2017/18 and 2018/19 financial years is provided in the table below, including the speed, location, vehicle make and vehicle model. Please note that all were civilian vehicles.

All the speeds shown were detected by police officers who would have been using handheld devices or calibrated speedometers.

All of the offences resulted in a prosecution, however the Constabularies do not receive the prosecution results back from the Magistrates Court and we are therefore unable to confirm what the specific penalty was.
