The response provided below is correct as of 17<sup>th</sup> October 2019.

Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies have considered your request and our response is below:-

Research has been undertaken of recorded crimes, for the offences listed in your request, where a victim's date of birth confirms that that are aged 18 years or over. This has returned 372 crime reports, for the two Constabularies, between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019.

With regard to Extortion, we have provided offences of Blackmail which come under Section 12 of the Theft Act.
