Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

Please find attached the relevant Speed Data recorded on Belvedere Road, Ipswich, that took place 22 November 2017 – 29 November 2017.

Please note that Suffolk Constabulary is only able to retrieve data where the road traffic accident has been reported to the Police, therefore there may be additional accidents which the force is unaware of.
