I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 1 November 2019 in which you sought access to the following information:

“A list of dine and dash crimes – people making off without payment for meals – using the search terms cafes and restaurants, reported between 2014 and 2019, including the top ten worst cases (i.e. most expensive), specifying date and cost, as well as any notable alcohol/expensive meals, outcome of incident, and sorted by year and location (i.e. town/village).”

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 5 November 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been conducted via our crime recording system Athena and our legacy system for all 'Making off without payment' offences that have taken place in restaurants/cafes etc.

The attached spreadsheet provides data from 2014 to 2019, broken down by date, town, value (if recorded) and the outcome of the crime.

Please be advised that the constabulary changed crime recording system during October 2015 from CIS to Athena. We have provided data from both systems, but please note this is not comparable.

Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide crime statistics to government bodies and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the crime data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the
Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
