I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 20 November 2018 in which you sought access to the following information:

*"I would like to find out about the number of calls received related to the synthetic drug monkey dust, also known as MDPV.*

*Specifically I would like to know:*

*- How many calls has your force received related to monkey dust in the last five years, broken down by month?"*

### **Response to your Request**

The response provided below is correct as of 21 November 2018

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

A search has been completed of the Constabulary's call data for all incidents recorded that contain the word 'Monkey dust' and 'MDPV'.

The Constabulary located a total of 2 calls in February and August 2015.

Please note that freetext searches are by their very nature not wholly precise and therefore the data supplied cannot be considered an accurate representation of information held by the Constabulary.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
