Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 6 December 2019

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

The Constabulary has completed a search for all offences that has been recorded with a location of ‘Harpers Hill’ and ‘Harpers Hill Farm’ and the postcodes of CO6 4NT and CO6 4NU.

The offences located have been provided in the table below, confirming the month/year of the offence, the offence category and the outcome.

Your Right to Request a Review of Decisions Made Under the Terms of the
Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 40 working days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
