



## **Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 004947-17**

I write in connection with your request for information received by Suffolk Constabulary on the 15 May 2017 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“Palgrave Parish Council would like to submit a Freedom of Information request to receive the FULL data from the recent speed data recorder results.*

*Indexes (registration numbers) are not requested, just the location, direction and statistical counts of number of vehicles within each speed band and, if available, the 85percentile speed. We are particularly interested in times of day when the traffic peaks as well as volumes per hour. You have previously supplied us with this detailed information for the SDR that was placed on Denmark Hill and I understand the only way to access this data is via a FOI Request.*

*This information will form an important part of how both the Parish Council and County Council address issues of speeding and heavy traffic volumes in the village.”*
