- a) The reasons the application was made*
- b) The restrictions on the individual applied for by police*
- c) If the order was granted by magistrates*
- d) If the order granted by the court included any amendments to the police application”*

Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 18 July 2017

Suffolk Constabulary has considered your request for information and the response is below.

Suffolk Constabulary has made two Sexual Risk order applications to the court, the details of which are below.

1.

- a) Investigated for 2 offences against vulnerable victims under 16yrs of age. Insufficient evidence for criminal conviction.
- b) Prohibited from starting and maintaining a relationship with any female under the age of 16 years old without first notifying your Public Protection Officer of her name, date of birth and address
Prohibited from living at an address or residing overnight at an address where a female under the age of 16 years old, other than a family member or relative, is present without first notifying your Public Protection Officer of that address and the name of the person living there.

- a) Criminal investigation resulting in a caution, no prohibited order made.
- b) Excluding nominal from any changing room facility where females may be naked or in a state of undress
Preventing him from having any image capturing device in his possession with which to record persons within changing rooms

Freedom of Information Act (2000).

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled, or if you think the decision is incorrect, you have the right to ask Suffolk Constabulary to review their decision.

Ask Suffolk Constabulary to look at the decision again.

If you are dissatisfied with the decision made by Suffolk Constabulary under the Freedom of Information Act (2000), regarding access to information, you must notify Suffolk Constabulary that you are requesting a review within 20 days of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request.
