



## Freedom of Information Request Reference N<sup>o</sup>: FOI 007820-17

I write in connection with your request for information received by Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies on the 27 December 2017 in which you sought access to the following information:

*“Please could you provide a list of all officers who have died between January 1 2002 and 1 December 2017, both on and off duty, while working for your force alongside the cause of death.*

*Could it be made clear where an officer has died on or off duty as well and the year in which they died?*

*Could this information be provided in spreadsheet format please?*

*Eg - Officer - killed in RTA - on duty - 2005 Officer - suicide - off duty – 2010”*

### Response to your Request

The response provided below is correct as of 27 December 2017

Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies have considered your request for information and our response is below.

In both Norfolk and Suffolk, the Death Certificate is not required for someone to leave under the code Death, therefore we do not hold details of how staff or officers died.

The information provided below is dated from 2004 (Suffolk) and 2005 (Norfolk) as both forces' HR systems only go back this far.

Please note that unless marked otherwise, all officers were processed with the code 'Death – Other', which would indicate they were not on duty at the time.

We have no records of any serving officer deaths during 2014, 2015 and 2016.
