**YOU SAID...**

Lack of Police presence for enforcement of parking and traffic offences in Beccles , Worlingham, and Bungay. ASB in the evenings around Beccles and Bungay.

**WE DID...**

Daily monitoring of parking in Puddingmoor ,during the hot weather, and 14 FPN issued to offending vehicles.  
Advised local business regarding their drivers exiting car park the wrong way and their customers parking.  
Parking offences in the town centre 10 FPN issued.  
Initial presence outside primary school deterring parents from parking on single yellow line and additional presence 4 FPN issued.

Welcome to the July edition of the Beccles and Bungay Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter! The Safer Neighbourhood Team have been busy again this month responding to issues in the community. We are working with other agencies to help reduce demand, on our resources, and help resolve local issues. A positive arrest for class A drugs, and cannabis, as a result of SNT. enquiries. The Summer is here and we continue to remind visitors, using the Lido, that parking is monitored around the Town Centre and in Puddingmoor. Vehicles parking illegally often restrict access for larger vehicles who have a need to use the road and traffic chaos can quickly ensue. Police will issue a Fixed Penalty Notice to offending vehicles which will be for £30. Please allow more time to park in one of the Town's ample public car parks and remember, **DON'T SPOIL YOUR DAY BY GETTING A PARKING TICKET!!!**

The Safer Neighbourhood Team continue to encourage the public to report any suspicious activity in the community. This time of year windows, doors, and garages are often left insecure. This can encourage opportunist thieves in the area. Please be mindful and don't leave windows and doors open if not in view of area. Remember to keep valuables out of sight, much the same as you would do in a parked car. When working in the garden try not to advertise what tools and equipment you have by leaving your garage/shed doors open unnecessarily, keeping them locked and secure overnight is essential.

We all use our bicycles more during the summer so please leave them secure by investing in a bike lock. 99% of theft reported is from bikes being left insecure.


Scams are often a concern for us all. If you think it is too good to be true then it probably is!! A way of reporting, or handy on line safety advice, is through contacting Action Fraud.
