1. Anti-Social use of motor vehicles in Bungay town centre.

WE DID...

1- Police Officers and PCSOs have attended Bungay on ten occasions since the 30th of October, specifically to target those using motor vehicles (and motorcycles) in an anti-social manner in the town. A motorcyclist was dealt with on 3rd Nov. for a noisy exhaust and not displaying 'L' plates and three Police Officers attended together on the 4th in order that they could cover all points of the town the issues are most likely to occur. Results were positive with a number of drivers and riders dealt with. We hope to continue these tactics to send the message we will be acting accordingly to the ASB use of motor vehicles.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Welcome to the October issue of the Beccles & Bungay Safer Neighbourhood newsletter.

The main issue the SNT have been dealing with these past four weeks has been the increase in the number of members of the Public contacting Police about the anti-social use of motor vehicles in Bungay.

Bungay is a small town with a close community and word soon circulates about who the offenders are and the vehicles involved.

If you wish to report something you've seen yourself to Police, please try and obtain the vehicle registration or (if not possible) it's appearance ie. make, model & colour. However, please don't place yourself in a position where it's obvious that you're acquiring this information.

Likewise, don't try & obtain video footage on a mobile device if it places you at risk.

Video evidence is very often the best type Police can utilise, but not if it's acquisition means placing the witness in harms way.

If you can observe, unseen from a safe distance, but still obtain the vehicle registration, Police will be in possession of good information we can act upon without having to deal with further offences which can occur if witnesses make themselves vulnerable. If the driver is known to use their vehicle in this manner frequently, the location, time and day can be passed to Police using electronic means such as e-mail so there's no need to make a telephone call immediately.

This does not just apply to offences involving motor vehicles, but to any type of criminal or suspicious activity.
