### You said...

School buses were causing havoc and distress, to local residents, by going against the locally agreed one way system in Kings Road Bungay.

### We did...

PCSO's made contact with all parties, including Suffolk County Council education. The situation resolved with the schools buses entering Kings rd and exiting via Queens rd. All coach companies aware and agreed .

Contact made to give advice to get help with housing etc.

Increase patrols, with the support of Lowestoft officers, in the area.

Multi agency meeting arranged to discuss issues raised .

### Responding to issues in your community

There were 149 reported crimes, for May, compared with 206 for the same period last year. (Last year there we had seen an increase in reports of vehicle damage.)

The breakdown is as follows:

The Town Centre parking issues addressed by issuing 19 FPN's during this period.

Speed checks have been carried out at two locations in Bungay, on the A144 & B1062, and on the Lowestoft Road Worlingham.

Out of 527 vehicles monitored 10 were over the speed limit and will be dealt with accordingly.

### Making the community safer

PCSO Deborah Osborne and PCSO Gary Wallace assisted teaching staff at Sir John Leman High school with their year 8 PSHE drug Awareness day. Students parents worked with their children on four different activities to improve and test their knowledge on effects also identify the different drugs.

## Preventing, Reducing and Solving Crime and ASB

There have been a few staff changes.

Pc Yeldham has come from both a Safer Neighbourhood Team background and more recently from Lowestoft Neighbourhood Response and has been with Suffolk Constabulary for 15 years. She will be updating the new Lowestoft Facebook page and the Lowestoft Twitter page with local policing information as well as the Parish Newsletters. She will also be attending some of the local events in the area and is looking forward to meeting the local community.

SNT continue to work to gather information, not only reduce demand, but help keep our community safe and dealing with local issues.

Theft from vehicles, and sheds, is still a local issue as well as county wide.

Power tools being a target therefore we continue to remind the public to remove valuables overnight from works vehicles and not leave anything on display.

SNT also recommend the following :-

Security Mark your Tools and property.

If you take the time to security mark your property, it will protect them against theft and assist the Police to return your property to you if it is stolen and recovered.

There are a number of ways of security marking your items, these include:

- Ultra violet (UV) or invisible marking -  
UV pens put an invisible mark on your property that can only be seen under UV light.
- Engraving or etching - Both methods are suitable for many hard surfaces and can be done using an electric engraving tool or hand engraver.
- Forensic marking solutions - These are harmless solutions that contain a unique forensic code (like a fingerprint), making it easy to identify marked items. Firms that provide these marking solutions include:

Keep an Inventory

We also recommend that you take colour photographs of any valuable or unusual items, paying special attention to distinguishing marks, initials or crests. Photographs should be taken against a plain background and include a ruler to give an idea of size. This assists the Police in press releases and social media to help recover the items.

Make a record of Serial and Model numbers plus anything else that can help identify your tools.
