### Thefts From Motor Vehicles

\* Vehicles in both Beccles & Bungay have been targeted in the past four weeks, with property being stolen from parked cars. There is a common thread between the offences however, in that the stolen items were all left on display inside the cars. Please remember to remove property from view when your vehicle is unattended, placing it either in the glovebox, under the seat or in the boot. Some of the vehicles in these incidents were left unlocked, making it even easier for the thief. With key-less entry on most vehicles these-days, there really is no excuse for not locking your car, even if for just a few minutes. This should also include when you attend a filling station and leave your car to pay for fuel.

### Halloween Posters

\* Halloween is nearly here again (31st October) with Trick & Treating possibly coming to your street. Those who Trick & Treat responsibly do not want to call at an address at which they're not welcome. For several years now, Suffolk Constabulary have produced A4 size posters which occupants can display in a front window to indicate if they welcome Trick & Treating or not. These are free and can be obtained from the Public Library in both towns and also from the Waveney Centre in Beccles. If your own child would like to Trick & Treat, please ensure they do so with an adult. This not only makes the children feel safer, it shows to those whose houses are called on that the children are more likely to behave themselves.
