* Roads policing link officer has been made aware and looking to carry out patrols and enforcement. Local SNT officers will be carrying out spot patrols in the areas identified to try and locate offenders and deal with for any offences committed.

OTHER NEWS:

Suffolk's Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore continues his 2017 series of public meetings across the county. He will be visiting Brandon on Tuesday 7th November 2017, at The Harvest Centre, Weeting, Brandon, IP27 OPW

Following the successful format of last year, the PCC will stage a meeting in each of the 18 Safer Neighbourhood areas. The meetings are an opportunity for the public to ask questions of the Commissioner and the Constabulary, and to find out more about policing in the county.

Each meeting will involve a quick overview from Tim Passmore and the local Inspector and then the public will have an opportunity to ask questions. The local Superintendent responsible for policing in the local area, will add operational context. There is no need to book, please just turn up. Tea and coffee will be served from 6.40pm.

SECURITY AND PROPERTY ADVICE:

As the Summer months are now upon us and the weather continues to improve, we would ask again that people make sure that all doors, gates, windows etc. on houses, sheds, outbuildings are secure and that cars and vans are locked when not being used. A large percentages of burglary and theft from motor vehicles reports we receive are due to opportunists finding insecurities.
