- 1. A persistent offender has caused on going Anti-social behavior in the village of Barnham, against a number of individuals and the village school. The suspect has now been charged with 3 offences of harassment and remanded pending a trial.
- 2. Regular patrols at these locations to identify offenders and use of ASB legislation to issue Community Protection Warning letters banning them from the sites.

PCC and CHIEF CONSTABLE ON TOUR

Each year the PCC and Chief Constable go 'On Tour' around the county to talk to local residents in seven town centres across the county – one in each district area. They will be in Bury St Edmunds on Wednesday 9th August, at the Arc Shopping Centre, Prospect Row, IP33 3DG between 11am and 2pm.

PCC'S Public Meeting

Suffolk's Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore continues his 2017 series of public meetings across the county with the next meeting in Bury St Edmunds on Tuesday 12th September.

Following the successful format of last year, the PCC will stage a meeting in each of the 18 Safer Neighbourhood areas. The meetings are an opportunity for the public to ask questions of the Commissioner and the Constabulary, and to find out more about policing in the county.

Each meeting will involve a quick overview from Tim Passmore and the local Inspector and then the public will have an opportunity to ask questions. The local Superintendent responsible for policing in the local area, will add operational context.

There is no need to book, please just turn up. Tea and coffee will be served from 6.40pm

Security advice issued following caravan thefts

Suffolk Police are issuing security advice to caravan owners following a number of caravan thefts in the county.




Between 28th May and 5th June offenders stole a caravan from a storage area on a site on Icklingham Road in West Stow.

Overnight on Tuesday 6 June three caravans were stolen from a storage area in a caravan park in Hinton. The caravans were all in a storage area rather than on pitches on site.

Ensure your caravan is locked and securely stored
Fit a tracking device and an alarm to your vehicle
Invest in good quality locks and lock the coupling head into a cover
Lock the wheels with locking wheel nuts
Keep valuables elsewhere if possible or out of sight
Consider security marking

Suffolk Police are continuing their #CouldYouBeSpecial campaign to attract recruits into the Special Constabulary. Being a member of the Special Constabulary opens up a range of special opportunities; to volunteer, to connect with your community, to get new skills, to extend your personal limits, to reduce harm, to inspire others to join, to make others and yourself proud of what you a difference you can make. Becoming part of a diverse organisation that fights crime in the county, it is also a positive way to try police work if you are considering a career as a full time officer.

Special Constables are volunteer officers who give their time to assist the regular police force in keeping communities in Suffolk safe. Committed recruits, keen to experience the rewards and challenges of policing are being actively sought. The role of a Special Constable includes providing high visibility patrols and helping to police major incidents and events. They also offer vital links in the partnership between the police service and the public.

If you are 18 years or older, in good health and of good character, you can apply. Full training will be given so that you can become part of a team that deals with a variety of incidents and events across Suffolk.

Karen Harris, Specials Manager said, "We are actively recruiting volunteer police officers to be stationed all around Suffolk. We welcome applicants with a range of skills and experience from across our community. Whatever hours you can offer, we are very keen to hear from you.
