WE DID...

1. Community Protection Notice's and Warning letters have been issued to 4 persons using the Anti-social Behaviour Crime and Police Act 2014 legislation, stipulating a number of conditions to curb the ASB and to improve the quality of life of the immediate community.
2. The SNT will be working closely with the Special Constables Rural Crime Team to tackle this issue over the coming months. A number of offenders have been arrested after committing hare coursing offences in the West of Suffolk and are on police bail while the investigations are conducted.

CHRISTMAS SHOPPING CRIME REDUCTION - DON'T HAND IT TO PICKPOCKETS

Avoid a "pick-a-pocket or two" by taking a few simple precautions:

- Keep your bag closed and close to you at all times if possible with the opening towards your body.
- Keep straps short and bags tucked under your arm.
- Keep purses secure and carry wallets in an inside pocket.
- Close your purse and put it away before you leave the till.

Protect Gadgets

- Install a tracker application on your smartphone, which could help trace your device if it's stolen.
- Stay alert and aware of what's going on around you when using your phone in public.
- Keep a record of the unique reference number (IMEI) on your mobile phone. To get this, dial *#06#.
- Always use your phone's security lock or PIN number.
- Use an ultra violet property marker to write your post code and house number on valuable possessions.
- Insure your possessions and keep the insurance details handy.

GET IN TOUCH

We wanted to remind you of the many ways you can get in touch with us. Most importantly, if it's an emergency always ring 999. However, if it's not an emergency but you wish to report a crime or a concern for safety then use 101. If you simply wish to contact your local team, perhaps to tell us about Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) or a series of crimes occurring in your area, or to tell us about your concerns about how the police have handled a local community matter, why not in the first instance speak with your local Sergeant and discuss the matter with them? Your local Sergeants will be able to review the matter and make an assessment about how well we did, reporting back to you with their findings. Your local community Sergeants are Anna Whybro and Lisa Vaughan. If you want to speak to your local officer and it's not urgent then an email will be quickest means to get in contact, and if you need a reply than a member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs. Remember, the demand on 101 is very high and if you don't need to report a crime we would encourage the use of email.
