Responding to issues in your community

Two drivers have been issued with warning letters regarding their driving in the Eye area. This is a result of our continuing efforts to tackle individuals who drive their vehicles in a way that causes distress to the local community.

Speed enforcement work has been conducted in Eye, Yaxley and Brome resulting in various drivers being issued with fixed penalty notices for driving whilst over the speed limit.

Making the community safer

Following support and training from our team, members of the Weybread Community Speed Watch scheme are now ready to commence speed checks in the village of Weybread.

Following complaints of speeding by residents, various speed data recorders have been set up around the locality. The recorders will monitor traffic flow and speeds before any enforcement action is considered.

A "No cold calling" zone has been launched successfully in Debenham with help from partner agencies.


Further signs will be displayed on the Eye airfield to help reduce the problem of vehicles being used in an anti-social manner.
