### You said...

Residents of Stradbroke had reported ongoing anti-social behaviour at various locations in the village.

### We did...

A working group consisting of Parish Council, High School, Sports Centre, Fire Service and Police came together to address this issue. Police have increased patrols in the area to reduce the amount of anti-social behaviour, the result is less reports being received.

### Responding to issues in your community

Officers have put in place various deterrents for anyone wishing to use their vehicle in an anti-social way at Horham airfield. This is following complaints from the landowners.

Weybread Community Speed Watch are nearly ready to begin conducting speed checks.

### Making the community safer

Local officers are going to issue a community protection notice warning to a persistent caller, who calls for police emergency even when there is no emergency. This follows ongoing work to try and prevent further calls.

Police are working with local residents who are keen to start up a new neighbourhood watch group in Eye.

### Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

A crime prevention meeting was held at Stradbroke Community Centre in response to shed break-ins at the allotments.

Officers have conducted reassurance visits to vulnerable persons, including victims of crime and making sure they are in contact with the relevant agencies.
