FURTHER INFORMATION

As part of our ongoing commitment to road safety we have continued to deal with the issues of speeding in our towns and villages with enforcement by the Safe Cam Team, SNT officers and the Special Constabulary, not only to enforce but to educate drivers about the consequences of speed.

A further demonstration/vigil took place at C & K Meats on the Mid-Suffolk Business Park. Our team was present outside the venue as well as being visible in other areas of the town during the day. The event was peaceful and passed without any incident. The team will continue to work with the local business and the organisers of the vigil.

The team have been dealing with parking related issues across the area ensuring that the roads are free from unnecessary obstructions keeping them safe for pedestrians and road users.

The SNT has extended its partnership working with teaching staff and Junior Road Safety Officers in local schools on speed awareness, illegal and inconsiderate parking and the hands off mobile phone campaign.

The team will continue to carry out licensed premises checks to ensure that landlords are complying with the terms of their licenses. We are working with the licensed premises to reduce underage drinking, and pub related ASB and drink driving. We have also been giving crime prevention advice to local businesses, helping them to keep themselves safe.

Pc Andrews-Pearce has been investigating several incidents of minor ASB being caused in Eye by small group of known youths. So far certain individuals have been interviewed and at this time enquiries are still ongoing.

Hare coursing still remains as issue within the Eye locality and the SNT are doing what they can to address this by carrying out high visibility rural patrols to deter offenders. However, we ask that the public remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity or individuals, particularly the importance of obtaining vehicle registration numbers.

PC Andrews-Pearce was a guest speaker at the Eastern Landlords Association meeting at Brome Grange, Eye. He gave a talk on ASB and cannabis factories.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

The effectiveness of investing in home security has recently been highlighted in Bury St Edmunds in an attempted burglary that has resulted in the arrest of a prolific burglar. The home owner in question had fitted a video enabled door bell. This sent a message to his phone alerting them that someone was at the his door of his house and streamed a video of the person, in this case trying to break in. The police were alerted and on viewing the video footage were able to identify the offender and make an arrest.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request. By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
