Responding to issues in your community

Officers and local owners have installed signs at Eye airfield to help reduce the amount of reported ASB coming from the site.

Officers have worked with land owners to help close an illegal encampment on private land in Palgrave.

Making the community safer

Following reports of speeding in the area of Thorndon Primary School, local officers have been working with the schools Junior Road Safety Officers, conducting speed checks in the area.

Licensed premises have been checked to ensure license conditions are being complied with. Swabs were also taken to establish if drugs are being used.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Over the past month officers from the local team have conducted crime prevention engagements at several locations. This was targeted at trades people to help reduce the number of stolen tools in the area.

Information was received regarding the potential for a large number of vehicles to attend Eye Airfield for the purposes of racing. Extra resources were put in place which resulted in a male being arrested on suspicion of driving while under the influence of drugs.
