# FURTHER INFORMATION

Due to various complaints raised regarding speeding vehicles in the areas of Stuston and Eye, our team have been working with our Safety Camera Team to assess the suitability of potential sites that could be used for enforcement action. Our team will continue to monitor speeds within the area to help deter speeding motorists.

The team attended a Parish Council meeting in Weybread to offer some updates and reassurance in relation to the recent murder investigation. For further information on the investigation, please refer to our website for more detail.

Our team have been investigating and dealing with neighbourhood related issues in the area of Wilby. The team are currently working with partner agencies and residents to reduce incidents of ASB within the area. The team continues to patrol the area to provide reassurance to local residents.

Our team attended a "Dementia Awareness" training session, which will be beneficial in our day to day roles of dealing with dementia and vulnerable missing persons within the community.

Our team continues to patrol areas of Eye, which have been subjected to criminal damage, namely the spray painting of graffiti. Whilst our team continues to investigate the issue we would ask members of the public to report any suspicious activity to police by telephoning 101, or 999 if the damage is happening at the time.

Our team have been conducting visible patrols in and around the area of Eye following a report of an indecent exposure. Although this is an isolated incident, we would ask members of the public to report any similar incidents.

Our team have been conducting local house to house enquiries within Debenham following a series of thefts whereby house numbers have been removed from various houses within a neighbourhood.

Our team have been assisting our CID department with enquiries connected with an arson connected with a business premises in Metfield. Reassurance patrols by the team have been conducted in the area. The

In the South of Norfolk various thefts of lawn mowers and vehicle trailers have been reported to police. Although this may not be connected to your area, we are asking residents to be security conscious and ensure that your property is locked and secure.

## Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that most matter to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

## How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

## Never leave an open invite!

Now that the warmer weather at lasts seems to have made an appearance there will be a tendency to leave windows open at home to let the breeze in. Be aware however that open windows can be seen as an opportunity for burglars, so please ensure that when going to bed vulnerable windows such as those downstairs, are shut. Also when leaving home check that you have closed and locked all your windows. Remember, Close it, Lock it, Check it.

## Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: [leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk](mailto:leiston.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk)

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
