FURTHER INFORMATION

In previous newsletters we have looked at how our Safer Neighbourhood Teams are working and how they can support vulnerable individuals within the community. This month we inform you of what our team has been working on.

1. Whilst crime levels remain low in the area, we have seen an increase recently in theft/burglary related offences between the dates of 8th June 2016 to 15th June 2016 there were eight theft/burglary related crimes reported to police which are detailed below:

Wingfield - 08/06/2016 - Theft from Motor Vehicle (tools taken from a van)
Debenham - 09/06/2016 - Attempted Burglary other Building (Debenham Co-op)
Eye - 09/06/2016 - Burglary Dwelling
Monk Soham - 10/06/2016 - Burglary other Building (£30,000 worth of farm machinery)
Stradbroke - 14/06/2016 - Burglary other Building (farm vehicle keys stolen)
Bedingfield - 14/06/2016 - Criminal Damage to farm vehicles
Stoke Ash - 15/06/2016 - Burglary other Buildings (Tack shed targeted)
Wilby - 15/06/2016 - Burglary other Building

Whilst each of these crimes are being investigated, our team are continuing to provide a visible presence in the area. We are speaking with local farmers, business owners and local residents to ensure crime prevention advice is provided and to help support those who feel vulnerable within the community. In order to help reduce property being targeted our team is asking for residents to:

- Ensure vehicles and buildings are left secure
- Ensure valuable items are not left on show and are stored securely.
- Ensure any suspicious behaviour is reported to police

If you would like any further crime prevention advice, please contact our team who will be able to advise you further.

2. Our team has worked with our partner agencies to help resolve neighbourhood disputes and community related issues including anti-social behaviour.

3. Following several complaints our team has worked with three primary schools in the Thorndon, Eye and Debenham areas to reduce parking related concerns. This is related to vehicles arriving and leaving the immediate area outside the schools. Our team have engaged with the parents at the school and offered advice. The parking situation will continue to be monitored by our team.

4. Following various reports of speeding in the Mendham, Hoxne, Fressingfield and Debenham areas our team have arranged for Speed Data Recorders (SDR's) to be implemented which will help measure the number of vehicles and speeds reached by passing traffic. Our team will use this data and work with the Suffolk County Council Highways to decide what further action is needed.

5. Our Major Investigation Team have been investigating a murder that took place in Weybread. Our team have been assisting by engaging with the local community, offering support by basing ourselves at the Weybread Village Hall as well as maintaining regular visible patrols in the area. For more information about this investigation, please refer to our website which will be able to provide more detail.

6. Our team conducted pro-active road safety events in the Eye area at the beginning of June. As a result of this event, over twenty vehicle's were stopped and the drivers spoken with. Five drivers were reported for speeding offences and one for not wearing a seatbelt.

In the month of June your SNT have also been dealing with the wider issues within the community, such as:

Mental health,
Domestic violence,
Youth work with local schools,
Youth Clubs,
Anti Social Behaviour (ASB),
Vulnerable people,
Licensing issues at both on and off license premises.

The team has also responded to complaints from the general public in relation to speeding, parking, dog incidents and neighbour disputes. This work allows our response teams to focus on responding to the emergency calls reported by the public.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999. The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
