FUTURE EVENTS

The Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore has launched his 2017 series of public meetings across the county with the next meeting being in Halesworth at 7pm on Tuesday, 13th June at the United Reform Church, Quay Street, IP19 8ER.

Future crime prevention public events will take place in July. The dates and venues are to be confirmed, but will be advertised in advance. Further details will follow.



FURTHER INFORMATION

Officers have attended the Eye Airfield area and spoken to numerous people in vehicles. Words of advice issued and also several offences dealt with on the spot. Safer Neighbourhood Team Officers and a Crime Reduction Officer are meeting with local landowners this month to discuss the long term solution.

Following a spate of anti-social behaviour in Eye Town centre, local Safer Neighbourhood Team officers gathered information, which led to the suspects being identified. Since then, incidents appear to have dropped. The investigation is ongoing and a positive outcome is being pursued.

We have been working closely with the public to identify suitable locations for the Safe Cam team to be deployed and carried out speed enforcement checks with the assistance of our Special Constabulary colleagues resulting in a number of fixed penalty notices and warnings being issued. Speed checks have been conducted in Stradbroke, Palgrave, Rishangles, Brome and Weybread. Many fixed penalty tickets have been issued, along with words of advice given to those just over the limit.

Following concerns and complaints around speeding in the parish of Weybread, the SNT have liaised with residents and the Parish Council to begin the process of setting up a Community Speedwatch Team. This will hopefully be in place by the summer.

Whilst on routine proactive patrols along the A140 between Brome and Stoke Ash, officers have checked documentation on numerous vehicles and as a result seized several vehicles for having no insurance. One vehicle contained two prohibited weapons, which were also seized and the driver further prosecuted for this offence.

Pc Andrews-Pearce has been working with community partners, housing associations and the youth offending service to provide a long term solution to youth related ASB. The team will continue to actively target those involved. There has been a decrease in reported ASB in the areas of Eye and Stradbroke.

With the summer months and better weather now in place, school pupils have been reminded of the effects that anti-social behaviour can have on the communities, with officers visiting Debenham High School to speak to them. Other school visits are planned this month to get the message out to stay safe.

Local Safer Neighbourhood Team officers recently met with the Suffolk Constabulary Mental Health Coordinator to conduct a visit to a resident with mental health issues. The visit was designed to reduce the amount of 999 calls made to us, and various agencies have been referred to the resident for help and support. Since the meeting, the demand on our services has reduced.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone.

There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

Crime Prevention Advice

Tips to secure your outbuildings:

- Avoid storing valuable items like power tools and sporting equipment like fishing rods and golf clubs in your shed. These should be kept inside your home or in a secure garage.
- Chain items such as bicycles, ladders and lawnmowers to a strong anchor point or to each other using a closed shackle padlock.
- Register your property at www.immobilise.com which is a free web-based property registration service.
- Remember to lock your shed or garage after use.
- Secure shed doors by fitting a strong hasp and staple (or 'padbad'). Secure this with coach bolts and lock the hasp over the staple with a closed shackle padlock.
- Secure shed door hinges with coach bolts of non-returnable screws (screws which can only be screwed in and not back out again).
- Replace any rotten door or window frames.
- Fit a good quality battery-operated alarm to your outbuilding.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
