# FURTHER INFORMATION

Road safety is a priority to the team and we have continued to deal with the issues of speeding in our towns and villages with enforcement by the Safe Cam Team; SNT officers and the Special Constabulary not only to enforce but to educate drivers about the consequences of speed.

We now have a Safety Camera vehicle and operator working from Eye SNT base, using our knowledge of local speeding issues in the community, we are able assist the safety Camera team.

The team continues to deal with parking issues across the area ensuring that the roads are free from unnecessary obstructions keeping them safe for pedestrians and road users.

The SNT has continued its partnership working with teaching staff and Junior Road Safety Officers in local schools on speed awareness, illegal and inconsiderate parking and the hands off mobile phone campaign. Looking ahead the team will be going to the secondary schools in the area to give presentations to pupils about Anti Social Behaviour prior to the school summer holidays.

We have been dealing with vehicle related ASB on Eye airfield, recognising the negative effect it has on the community and will continue to patrol the area to prevent and deal robustly with offenders. The team is also working with landowners of the airfield to develop contingency planning and target hardening to deter illegal traveller encampments.

Officers will continue to carry out targeted patrol in areas currently and previously affected by ASB to prevent and deter incidents of disorder.

The team will continue to carry out licensed premises checks to ensure that landlords are complying with the terms of their licenses. We are working with the licensed premises and our community safety department to reduce underage drinking, and pub related ASB and drink driving.


The team carried out a crime prevention event in Market Place, Eye giving crime prevention advice to the community, we will continue to work with our community engagement partners to keep the public updated about crimes and events via social media.

Reports have been made of thefts/burglaries to sheds, garages and outbuildings where garden equipment and power tools have been stolen. We have provided below some crime prevention advice to help secure properties and prevent equipment from being stolen.

A further demonstration/vigil took place at C & K Meats on the Mid-Suffolk Business Park. Our team were present outside the venue as well as being visible in other areas of the town during the day. The event was peaceful and passed without any incident. The team will continue to work with the local business and the organisers of the vigil.

## Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone.

There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

### How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

## Crime Prevention Advice

### Tips to secure your outbuildings:

- Avoid storing valuable items like power tools and sporting equipment like fishing rods and golf clubs in your shed. These should be kept inside your home or in a secure garage.
- Chain items such as bicycles, ladders and lawnmowers to a strong anchor point or to each other using a closed shackle padlock.
- Register your property at [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com) which is a free web-based property registration service.
- Remember to lock your shed or garage after use.
- Secure shed doors by fitting a strong hasp and staple (or 'padbad'). Secure this with coach bolts and lock the hasp over the staple with a closed shackle padlock.
- Secure shed door hinges with coach bolts of non-returnable screws (screws which can only be screwed in and not back out again).
- Replace any rotten door or window frames.
- Fit a good quality battery-operated alarm to your outbuilding.

## Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request.

By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: [eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk](mailto:eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk)

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
