Responding to issues in your community

This month, PCSO Martin has been to a number of rural parishes around Eye conducting speed enforcement. These include Victoria Hill (Eye), Hoxne, Wetheringsett, Debenham (twice), Rishangles (three times), Laxfield Rd. Stradbroke & Palgrave. Two fixed penalty notices were issued to vehicles parked on double yellow lines on Castle Street, Eye.

Making the community safer

This month, Suffolk Constabulary sent out requests via the 'Police Connect' messaging system, asking for nominations for deserving individuals who'd benefit from being given a video door bell free of charge. There were a limited number we could supply, and SNTs were involved in delivering the door bells to recipients in the Eye area.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

During August, SNT Officer PC Peck attended a public house in Eye to a report of a male refusing to leave the premises. The male was abusive towards the Officer in front of a number of families and other members of the public and was arrested for being Drunk & Disorderly. The male was charged and appeared at Ipswich Magistrates Court on the 28th, found guilty and fined.

Future events

Suffolk Constabulary has announced considerable changes to the Safer Neighbourhood Teams, with the number of PCSO posts being reduced. The changes do however mean more Police Officers working in the SNTs, with 104 Officers being moved into teams throughout the county. These changes will start to take effect from the end of October 2018.
