Bury's New PCSO's

Four new PCSOs have gone on duty at Bury St Edmunds police station, including the first paid for by the town council. All the police community support officers are new to policing and bring skills from past jobs or qualifications. In line with Suffolk Police's new policy, they all have a 'single point of contact' (SPOC) role which often highlights that. Emily Howell, 23, is the PCSO funded by Bury Town Council and comes to the force after doing a three year degree course on forensic sciences. "I thought it brought me to a more front-line police role," she said. "Because the town council have funded me I get to patrol more than the others, SPOC roles give them more responsibility in those areas, but they patrol less." She will work with town councilors in areas of concern they have. Jessy Whurr, 19, was a business development manager and said: "I always wanted to work in the police and thought it was a good route in to progress as a long-term career." Her SPOC is youth and young people. Ryan Chivers, 24, worked in an NHS mental health unit so his SPOC is, not surprisingly, mental health. He said: "I just like engaging with people and helping people. I'm happy in a community-based role." Michelle Bixley, 28, had nearly 11 years in retail. "I thought it was time for a change, now they are recruiting," she said. "It's something I always wanted to do."

Suffolk Police are launching a New Year #CouldYouBeSpecial campaign to attract recruits into the Special Constabulary. Being a member of the Special Constabulary opens up a range of special opportunities; to volunteer, to connect with your community, to get new skills, to extend your personal limits, to reduce harm, to inspire others to join, to make others and yourself proud of what you a difference you can make. Becoming part of a diverse organisation that fights crime in the county, it is also a positive way to try police work if you are considering a career as a full time officer.

Special Constables are volunteer officers who give their time to assist the regular police force in keeping communities in Suffolk safe.
