YOU SAID...

1. Increase Police patrols along the Sea front Felixstowe.
2. Cycling on Pavements and using pedestrian crossing Garrison Lane/ High Rd Fxt
3. Parking outside schools.

WE DID...

1. Targeted patrols in Martello Park to address ASB on the play area and adjacent parking areas. Some of the identified young people have been visited with parents present to highlight the issue. Detached youth workers have commenced patrols to engage with young people in the area. Reports of ASB incidents much reduced.
2. Leaflets and information circulated to Felixstowe Academy regarding cycling safety and advice over cycling offence. Advice has been given to cyclists infringing laws.
3. The council ASB Officer is researching a Junior PCSO scheme involving local schools and children engaging with motorists outside the schools during peak times.

FURTHER INFORMATION

During the month of September 2016 Felixstowe had 196 recorded investigations : (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also investigations into safeguarding individuals).

Included in these investigations was a street robbery where an elderly victim was approaching her front door and had her handbag snatched from her, the suspect then made off on a pedal cycle. Investigations identified a suspect who was located and arrested during the Community Impact event on the 13th of September. This male has subsequently been charged for this and other offences and is currently on remand, secure from society.

3 teenage boys were arrested in connection with a series of theft from motor vehicles. Investigations recovered stolen property. The offenders are currently being assessed for a correctional programme with the Youth Offending Team.

The Trimleys had 19 investigations

2 x Theft from Motor vehicles.

There was also a break in at a building site where expensive GPS equipment was stolen.

Nacton and Purdis Farm had 23 recorded investigations:

9 theft reports taken from retail outlets in the area.

Kirton ward had 8 recorded investigations which includes 2 shed break ins in the Waldringfield area.

Community Impact Day September 13th

Officers from the organisations involved were on hand to address areas of concern amongst residents, including crime, fire safety, rogue traders, education welfare, graffiti, littering, licensing, food safety, parking issues, school truancy and damaged street signs and furniture.

Here are some of the outcomes from the impact day on Tuesday 13 September:

- 90 speeding tickets were issued by Suffolk Police
- The Police made two arrests
- Environmental Health visited 48 premises to give health and safety advice
- 15 items on sale in shops were identified as out of date by Environmental Health
- The guide Dogs for the Blind Association assessed disability access and usage of taxis in the town, 4 out the 5 tests were successful. They also assessed access to local facilities in the town
- Suffolk Coastal Norse cleaned graffiti, cleared overgrown vegetation, removed furniture outside home, deployed street cleaners, gave bin collection advice, replaced dog littering posters and conducted litter picks
- Trading Standards visited residents to give scam advice
- The Fire Service tested residents smoke alarms and carried out PAT testing
- The Elections team visited local care homes to invite people to register to vote
- Street furniture and signs were assessed for replacement or signs which were obstructed cleared
- Suffolk Coastal's Anti-social Behaviour Officer monitored parking at schools.

There was also a week of action carried out across the Souther area by SNT Officers and colleagues from the Roads Policing unit. Activity included Hi-Vis patrols in areas highlighted with ASB issues, Intelligence gathering and patrols to disrupt drug dealing activity. A number of fixed penalty tickets for illegal parking were issued in the Town center area of Felixstowe. There were further Speed checks carried out by PCSO's and members from the Community Speed Watch group around locations on the peninsular.
