FUTURE EVENTS

The Community Speed Watch groups have been operating at a number of locations throughout the area. This already has made an impact on the speed of vehicles. 16 advisory letters have been sent out to the registered owners of vehicles recorded driving with excess speed. The speed checks will continue throughout September. Please watch your speed.

There is a Community Impact event in Felixstowe on Tuesday 13th of September. Multi agencies are dealing with a number of issues including speed checks, exceeding weight limit restrictions on road, litter, road safety and much more.



FURTHER INFORMATION

During the month of August 2016 Felixstowe had 183 recorded investigations : (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also investigations into safeguarding individuals).

Among the investigations were a series of domestic burglaries where entry was gained either through open windows or insecure doors. The property stolen were small portable items such as cash, mobile phones, jewelry and tablets. In some cases the offender had entered properties through insecure doors where the occupants were in the garden. In one case the victim disturbed the suspect who pushed her to the ground in order to make good their escape. These burglaries occurred late in the afternoon.

In another burglary the suspect had entered a public house after cutting some CCTV cables and stole items including the cash register. Unfortunately for the offender they had not cut through the internal CCTV camera cable and from the images Police identified him resulting in his arrest and charge for burglary.

The Trimleys had 19 investigations

2 x Theft from Motor vehicles. One involving the theft of power tools the other where a container lorry parked on the A14 had items stolen from the container overnight. This was part of a number of similar incidents along the A14 where containers were breached and items stolen.

There were a number of minor assaults investigated where the offenders were known.

Nacton and Purdis Farm had 33 recorded investigations:


3 Dwelling Burglaries, one of these in Nacton where the rear patio doors were forced and jewelry and cash was stolen, another on Purdis farm via an insecure door when a lap top was taken and one in Bucklesham Road via an open window, once again cash and jewelry stolen.

There were a number of theft investigations at a local supermarket.

Kirton ward had 5 recorded investigations which included a road rage incident in the Newbourne area.

CHURCH LEAD THEFT

Rural churches are often targeted due to their isolated locations so members of the public are asked to report any suspicious activity they see. Stealing a large amount of lead takes time and a reasonably large vehicle to transport it, so any early reports will assist police in locating offenders.

Chief Inspector Matt Rose said "We are asking local people to take an interest in their local church whilst they are out and about. If you take the dog out for a walk, or go for a stroll, don't ignore anything that you think looks out of place - report anything you think may be suspicious to the police. Communities can act as our eyes and ears, and by pulling together to note suspicious activity, we can deter thieves and help keep these historic buildings safe"
