You said...

1. Address the issue of rough sleepers in Felixstowe.
2. 'County Lines' Drug trafficking from vulnerable persons homes.
3. Operation Parkland tackling Anti-Social Behaviour in Parks over the summer period.

We did...

1. Bring together all relevant agencies and contact support groups.
2. Utilise the 'Help the Homeless' campaign used in Ipswich.
3. Additional patrols and disruption visits to suspected addresses.
4. Use of Police stop search powers to target identified suspects.
5. Intelligence gathering and crime reduction targeting for vulnerable premises.
6. Regular patrols of local parks and open spaces to prevent ASB.

Responding to issues in your community

During the month of May, there was a total of 280 investigations in the Felixstowe and District. (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Criminal Offences recorded range from various assaults and public order offences to theft and burglary and drug possession.

Making the community safer

On 11th May 2018 Police attended a report of a suspicious vehicle in Marsh Lane Felixstowe. On arrival two males were found hiding in bushes. The males were in possession of a small amount of Cannabis and issued with a fine.

On 12th May 2018 early hours of the morning Police Patrolling the area heard a male and female shouting in Tomline Road Felixstowe. Male arrested for causing Harassment Alarm and Distress and issued a fine.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

On 7th May 2018 at 8pm Police were called to an altercation in the play area of Coronation Park, Coronation Drive Felixstowe. A male was arrested for being Drunk and Disorderly and was subsequently arrested for assaulting two Police Officers, Racially Aggravated Harassment and Criminal Damage. The 43 year old male has been charged to court.

On 28th May 2018 following a neighbour dispute in Manwick Road Felixstowe a male was charged with Assault and Threatening and Abusive Behaviour.
