Responding to issues in your community

During the month of October 2018 there was a total of 318 investigations in the Felixstowe and District. (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Criminal Offences recorded range from various assaults and public order offences to theft and burglary and drug possession.

Making the community safer

Following a number of crimes reported in Kirton between 20th and 21st October 2018 one male was arrested and interviewed in custody. He was later released under investigation.

On 30th October 2018 an operation to target Criminals using Suffolk's roads saw more than 50 vehicles stopped in Felixstowe. There were 10 arrests for drug driving and fail to appear warrants. There were 9 vehicles issued with prohibition notices by the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency for no insurance and Licence offences. Two vehicles were seized and 27 Traffic Offences were reported. A great example of partnership working.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Between 13th and 20th October Suffolk Constabulary supported Hate Crime Awareness week "any crime that is motivated by hostility on the grounds of disability, religion or belief, race, sexual orientation or transgender identity can be classed as a hate crime"

On 27th October 2018 Police launched a new approach to Crime Prevention. The new brand known as 1st Principal originates from Sir Robert Peel's nine principals of modern Policing. Visit www.suffolk.police.uk/advice/crime-prevention-z for advice on Crime Prevention.
