Responding to issues in your community

Following several reports of ASB and criminal damage in the Stoke by Nayland area, we attended the local parish council meeting to listen to residents about their concerns so that we can target our policing response.

This is now one of our policing priorities and we are conducting patrols both high visibility and in plain clothes with the intention of identifying and dealing with those who are responsible.

Drug use in the Hadleigh area remains another priority for us. We continue to conduct visibility patrols in known 'hot spot' areas. We rely on information from you the public to let us know where this is taking place. If you see any suspicious activity or anti-social behaviour in your area, please contact us on the details below.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

Please be vigilant of strangers or cold callers in your area and alert us as soon as possible if you are suspicious.
