Responding to issues in your community

The team have been continuing with their patrols of hotspot ASB areas and are taking a robust approach with dealing with anyone found causing any offences. There is a multi agency meeting being planned to work with the parents of the youths involved to try and reduce further problems.

Speeding is a big issue and the team are continually grateful for all the hard work from the community speedwatch teams across the area. The SNT have a Speed Indication Device (SID) which you will see out in the community. On 11th October the team held their first Speeding day of Action and these will be continued every few weeks, to enforce and educate motorists.

Making the community safer

The team continue to engage with youths across the area who are causing issues within the community and we are also working with local shops and businesses. The SNT work very closely with the youth offending service and a further two youths have been referred this past month. A second passive drugs dog operation will hopefully be planned in the coming weeks and we will focus again on the hotspot areas which we are already aware of. If there is a particular problem in your area with the use of drugs then please get in contact so that we can include this in our operation. The SNT have held their first Speeding Day of Action and have been out with Special Constables conducting speed checks. We have been supported by the Community Speedwatch Teams and the Safety Camera Van. These Day of Action will hopefully be a regular event every 4-6 weeks.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

As already mentioned the team are working closely with partner agencies to look at other ways to engage with youths causing ASB to reduce it further. The SNT are keen to hear from anyone who experiences ASB and can submit any information on those causing it anonymously should you not want to provide your details. The team are also working with local hotels to reduce crime within the car parks to the premises, this is being completed jointly with the crime prevention officers within the Community Safety Department.
