Welcome to the Hadleigh SNT.

On 10th May myself and Inspector Horton attended the annual Parish Forum which was held in Hadleigh. I was pleased to see so many representatives from the different parishes and it was useful to hear concerns from the community. The Parish forum remains the main event for engagement with the Parish councils as we are not able to commit to attend local meetings on a regular basis. This is an opportunity for the community to speak with myself and Inspector Horton about any policing matters.

A new summer initiative has just started in the Southern area and there is now a dedicated team of police officers and special constables who will be working with partner agencies to tackle anti social behaviour during the summer period. Intelligence and statistics suggests that the level of ASB rises during the months of June - September and therefore the team will be looking at ways to address these problems across the areas. There is currently a monthly meeting where analytical work is carried out to identify the Victims, Offenders and locations in each area which are causing the most harm to the community. This is where the SNT set their priorities for the month and it is therefore vital that members of the public contact police to report any incidents of concern. The SNT's will be able to 'bid' for the new proactive team to come to their area to focus on a particular problem. Hadleigh SNT have an operation planned in early July where we will be working with the proactive team to target specific areas where we believe there is ASB and drug use.

The SNT will be running their next engagement event in Hadleigh on 14th June from 10:00-13:00. The will be members of the team at Morrisons supermarket during these times and there will be other members on foot patrol in the area. This is an opportunity for members of the community to speak with the team about any policing problems they would like assistance with.

There has been an increase in residential burglaries in the Hadleigh area in the last month and we would urge people to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity to police at the time of witnessing it. Now the weather is improving it is vital that homeowners remember to secure their properties by locking doors and windows before going out. Ensure your vehicles are left secure at all times and valuables are out of sight.

The SNT have been in contact with the Parish Council in Elmsett and also Babergh District Council to address issues of ASB in the area. At the beginning of June questionnaires were delivered to all residents of one road asking for their opinions of how much of a problem with ASB they thought there was in their area. I was pleased to see a number of these completed and returned to us and we are hopeful that we will be able to address this in the next few weeks. If you feel there is a particular problem in your area and would benefit from a ASB questionnaire in your area then please get in touch and we will come to your road/street and look at what we can do to address the problems.
