Responding to issues in your community

The youth shelter in Halesworth has now been re-located. The Town Council has utilised the services of a very experienced and well regarded youth worker to monitor its' use and engage with the young people. So far reports have been almost overwhelmingly positive. There has been a single incident of damage reported to a brick wall nearby and this is under investigation.

Making the community safer

Suffolk Constabulary announced in July, changes to the Safer Neighbourhood Teams. Some of these changes will mean the loss of a number of PCSO posts. Should councils (town or parish) wish to, they can fund a PCSO post, meaning a dedicated service for the funding provider. Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB

The SNT has this month been responding to a number of reports about anti-social behaviour in Halesworth. It's worth mentioning that not all ASB is caused by alcohol or drugs or committed by parts of the community often thought of as more likely to be involved. ASB can sometimes be as a result of mental health issues. Police may still be the first agency to respond to reports, but, under such circumstances, we work closely with partners to offer support to the victims and seek the help needed by the involved party.
